

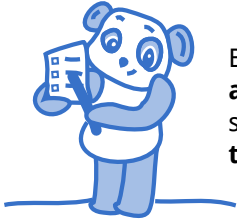

## Attendee Checklist

- Create a blog! Blogging is an essential part of an open source community. There's a variety of providers out there that host your blog for free: [blogger.com](http://blogger.com) and [wordpress.com](http://wordpress.com) are examples
- If you feel like it, you can even host a blog on your own server. That is not a requirement, though. What matters to us is the fact that you have a blog. Once you do, write its address here:

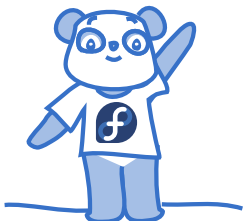
